Serving that number of diners is a monumental task in normal circumstances but to do so with 3 excellent courses and with speed and efficiency showed the professionalism of the kitchen staff and waiting staff. Presentations were made quickly and efficiently with the assistance of runners and only major trophy winners given the opportunity to speak.

The Mid South Coast Golfers Association hosted the Shoalhaven Week of Golf with 116 competitors [73 men and 44 ladies] with one couple travelling from Adelaide. There was a 20% decrease in the overall field with regular competitors were down by a third. Local numbers again made up a third of the field. One change this year was the attendance of a large group of men and lady Korean golfers which present some additional challengers for organiser due to language difficulties. Without this group there would have been a very poor field.

The three of the four courses, ST Georges Basin, Shoalhaven Heads and Worrigee Links were in great condition. Nowra was disappointing with fairway and greens being in very ordinary condition which attracted some adverse comment from players. Notwithstanding the courses were well set up for veteran golfers. Competitors were particularly pleased with the free drink cart and lunch at Worrigee.

The Presentation Dinner was once again held at the Nowra Golf Club again who excelled itself with its venue and probably its best dinner in years. There was good entertainment an much dancing. The prize presentation was well organised and not drawn out. Of interest is that long term former NSWVGA Councillor Col Darly won the NSW Shield.

Accommodation Facilities, Caravan Parks and Business' within the region again benefitted from the influx of many veteran golfers.

This year saw a change in the organisation of the week with the retirement of long standing tournament Coordinator John Buttle. His work was formally acknowledged in a special presentation. He was replaced with a committee made up of participating Clubs. This was a learning process for call and likely to see further changes in the future.

Registration: No registration as such but a "meet and greet" in a small room in the clubhouse on Sunday afternoon. Finger food was provided but barely sufficient for the number of people in attendance. This issue was discussed with the TD at a meeting on Monday afternoon.

Event Format: Three days of Stableford with a 54 hole event in conjunction and a 54 hole Stroke event for the Neville Reid trophy for A Grade players. A 2 BBB Stableford was held on Friday. Due to the heat at this time of the year it was decided to commence play early each day with shot gun starts. Play was also conducted on both courses, Captains and Presidents which were enjoyed by all players. NSWVGA shield was played for over 18 holes on Thursday. An additional shield is required for the women's competition.

Presentations: These were held on Friday at the conclusion of the 2BBB event at a luncheon in the club house. Approximately 150 people were present and were served an excellent one course meal. Presentation of trophies was quick and efficient with a few short speeches.

Summary: The new format of playing this event entirely at Tocumwal Golf and Bowls club was a successful move indicated by the number of players in attendance, an increase of approximately 30 more than last year.
