Numbers were very good with a total of 207 registrations of which 123 were males and 84 females. A total of 55 clubs were represented. Daily numbers were Monday 182, Tuesday 168, Thursday 166 and Friday 142. On Friday two 4BBB competitions were held – one in the morning and one in the afternoon. There were 3 grades for men and 2 for ladies.

Much credit is due to the TD Paul McDougall who together with his committee ran a very well organised event. His committee is comprised of about eight members from both Tamworth and Longyard. The committee works very well and operates almost twelve months of the year.

The NSWVGA Trophy for men and ladies was played for over 36 holes on the Monday and Tuesday on both courses. This is used as the major trophy for the week and the prizes given by NSWVGA are augmented by the organisers.

The presentation dinner was held on the Thursday night and was very well attended with good support from sponsors. Their major sponsor has indicated continuing support for this event.

As noted, the weather was excellent although the region suffers like most of NSW from lack of worthwhile rainfall.

Players provided worthwhile feedback on issues requiring attention, including the late finish on Friday. The tournament Director was apprised of these & undertook to consider & attend to them. It is important that Tournament Directors' are assisted by their committees to ensure the smooth running of these tournaments which also means that travelling players will return & enjoy them.

The course was in excellent condition considering the lack of rainfall, whilst the greens were very fast & difficult to read as reflected in the scores. Certainly a good test of golf.

Summary: with attention to the issues raised by players, this tournament should continue to attract a wide field of players both from NSW & Interstate.
