Some clubs have a Vets' newsletter - please publicise these upcoming events. Non participation at Open Days by some clubs has been the one disappointment in my tenure as N.R.V.V.G.A. President.

In the meantime, however, may I congratulate all Presidents and Executives of all clubs for your continued efforts to supply to your members and visitors a weekly enjoyable golfing atmosphere. It is through your efforts that Group 14 now has in excess of 2,000 playing members. Congratulations in particular to Woodenbong, who with about a dozen members is able to keep their club in a good playing condition and run a very successful Open Day. Lismore, under the leadership of Noel Ball retain the Open Day traveller numbers.

Sincere thanks to Secretary/Treasurer Ray for his continuous efforts. Under his leadership, my position as President has been made easy and I know he is appreciated by all clubs. Our NSW Delegates, John and Peter keep us informed and up to date on the happenings at Head Office – thank you. A letter has been written to our previous delegate Kel Pearce thanking him for his years representing us at NSW.

In conclusion, I thank all delegates for the continued support representing your individual clubs; through your participation and efforts we have a great Group.
